When & why was the RCC established?





The Research Careers Campus Graz brings together the previous offerings of DocService, the Doctoral Academy and the Postdoc Office in one institution. Mid-career researchers (assistant professors, senior scientists with EV/QV) are added as a new target group.

Why was the RCC established?



The Research Careers Campus Graz is the central institution for academic career support at the University of Graz.

The RCC engages with researchers in all phases of an academic career, from doctoral education to professorship as a partner for their development.

The RCC's overarching goal is to maintain and improve the positive research culture at the University of Graz.

We support 17 internationally oriented research groups conducting research on an overarching topic (RCC consortia) and promote structured doctoral training. We host pizza nights, PhD pub crawls, writing retreats and Fiasco parties. We support & encourage meetings of writing groups, the supervisor network, the MCAA, Mothers in Science and other researcher-led groups.





We organise more than 40 half-day to two-day workshops per year for (early-career) researchers on topics ranging from appointment training to Python and doctoral supervision to science communication.

We award the Seraphine Puchleitner Award for doctoral supervision, which is unique in Austria, and organise the Graz 3-Minute Thesis Competition, in which doctoral researchers explain their doctoral theses to a lay audience in three minutes. In 2024, the University of Graz 3MT winner also won the European Coimbra Group Competition, and in 2025, the University of Graz winner came second in the European CG 3MT final.

The Research Careers Campus funds three projects with up to €5,000 that aim to contribute to the establishment of positive practices and disrupt the (unconscious) perpetuation of less effective practices.

This call is open to all university members (including researchers, students, and research managers) who are passionate about research at the **University of Graz**.

Your project could, for example, cover the following areas:

- Scientific Integrity / Good Scientific Practice, Peer support and peer advice, representation, working groups, buddy systems
- ✓ Supporting early career colleagues, Culture of handling mistakes and failure,
- Accessibility, Academic kindness, Communication, Leadership
- Societal impact, Welcome culture and onboarding, Performance assessment and peer review
- ✓ Open Science, Anti-discrimination and diversity, and much more.

How and for what can the money be used?

Once awarded, the Ambassador Grant will be transferred to an internal department/cost center at the university and can be used as needed (in accordance with the university's guidelines).


